

FAMILY DISASTER PREPAREDNESS:

Ways to Engage your Congregation in Family Disaster Preparedness

Family preparedness is so important that we invite you to think about how you might make this a ministry of your church, to help your congregation be prepared for disasters. So how might you do this?

- Church or neighborhood "Family Preparedness" Fair an event held in the parking lot perhaps that includes others from your community.
 - You can have a "Go-Bag" scavenger hunt
 - Invite members of the fire dept. to talk about fire extinguisher use and maintenance
 - Fire safety talk
 - Have preparedness games with preparedness prizes
 - Give away backpacks for "Go Bags" perhaps some might be donated
 - Seek community sponsors
 - Serve simple lunch
 - Invite the Red Cross to provide a talk on the "Pillowcase Project"
- After worship "Family Preparedness Activity" once per month
 - Scavenger Hunt with Go-Bag items
 - Make Go-Bag kits
 - Decorate pillowcases for children's "Go Bag" add drawstring
 - Play "Preparedness TRIVIA", "Resilience BINGO", etc.
 - Invite fire dept. community resources, fire safety, fire extinguisher
 - Offer the "Pillowcase Project" as a teaching tool for children and youth/families following worship
- Work through the Family Disaster Preparedness Plan
 Workbook, one section at a time, having families go home
 and work on completing one item and returning the next
 Sunday or month
- Use disaster story books for children's sermon
- Host an adult Christian Formation class on Family Preparedness for adults
- Incorporate Disaster Preparedness into children and youth Christian Formation classes.
- Use card games and other items at Ready.gov/kids as prizes for Disaster Preparedness games
